Tackling Debt on our Doorstep

Claire tells her story about the impact of extortionate lending at a Debt Hearing in Newcastle.

Pat from the local CAP group identifies this as an issue CAP should be campaigning on.

Alan from CAP works with partners from MAA and others to launch the *Debt on our Doorstep* campaign.

Sue from a church in Newcastle writes to her MP Barry about Claire's story and the need for action to tackle extortionate lending.

Barry signs an Early Day Motion in Parliament and has a word with the Minister responsible.

Claire travels to Westminster to a Policy Forum Alan has organised to explain the situation to Civil Servants from the Department for Work and Pensions.

Claire tells her story about the impact of extortionate lending live and the Minister has to justify the Government's policy live on GMTV.

The Minister lobbies the Treasury for funding to do something.

Gordon Brown announces a new £125 million Financial Inclusion Fund, to pay for more face-to-face money advice and investment in affordable credit.

Claire's local **credit union** gets a grant of £750,000 from the Financial Inclusion Fund to expand its work, and the local **CAB** gets a grant to employ a new Debt advice worker.

Claire (and 40,000 people like her) get the chance to have professional debt advice – and a cheap loan from their Credit Union.
